Support Facilities Supporting Data

The purpose of the Support Facilities Element is to ensure the provision of support facilities to meet University needs during the planning period.

1. Inventory and Analysis of Existing Conditions

l.a. Inventory of Existing Support Building Space

Table 6.1.a shows an inventory of existing building spaces on the Tallahassee Campus that are used for support facilities. Support spaces are identified in the Guidelines in four categories: administrative offices, physical plant, general auxiliary (such as day care), and student support services and activities. Individual building total NASF and GSF are shown as well as NASF and GSF subtotals for each category. Area for temporary buildings was not included.

Figures 6.1.1, 6.1.2, and 6.2 shows in graphic form the location of these support facilities, categorized by the same four types of use as above.

1.b. Inventory of Intercollegiate Athletic and Fitness/Recreational Facilities

The FSU Tallahassee Campus supports a wide variety of athletic activities. FSU has a first-class football stadium that seats nearly 80,000 and serves as a major campus focal point of activity. The campus also has excellent baseball, swimming, tennis, gymnasia, and other intercollegiate athletic facilities.

Table 6.2 shows the total number of fitness/recreation and intercollegiate athletic ball fields, courts, etc. on the Tallahassee Campus of FSU. Usage figures are included where available. Games in the softball, baseball, basketball, and volleyball facilities are held according to NCAA guidelines and schedules. Numbers in parentheses indicate that those fields are counted elsewhere. For instance, in **Table 6.2**, the total numbers of basketball and tennis courts are shown first, and then are broken out by gender of user. Also, in **Table 6.3**, the fitness/recreational fields support a variety of fitness/recreational programs. Acreage figures are rounded to the nearest acre and correspond to the shaded areas on **Figures 6.3** and **6.4**

On the Tallahassee Campus, indoor fitness/recreational activity is focused on two locations: the Bobby E. Leach Student Recreation Center, opened in 1991, and the Fitness & Movement Clinic in the Coburn Wellness Center, opened in 2012. Both facilities are located on the west side of campus. The facilities record approximately 900,000 visits combined each year. In total, FSU has approximately 150,000 square feet of dedicated indoor fitness/recreational space. The

amount of indoor general fitness/recreational space is inadequate at this time when compared to industry standards.

Outdoor fitness/recreational fields also provide a variety of recreational opportunities. Outdoor facilities are concentrated in three locations: the western side of the Tallahassee Campus, the southern side of the Tallahassee Campus, and the western side of the Tallahassee Campus Southwest. The Tallahassee Campus locations are close enough to provide easy access to all FSU users. The Tallahassee Campus Southwest location requires a short drive for Tallahassee Campus residents. Outdoor fitness/recreational field space supports not only planned intramural activities, but sport club activities and informal recreation ("pick-up games" or "open recreation").

Three complexes comprise the outdoor fitness/recreational space for FSU. The Main Campus Fields (formerly the "Intramural Sports Complex"), opened in 1998, is a 12-acre facility located across from Doak Campbell Stadium on the south side of the Tallahassee Campus. The Westside Courts (formerly the "Salley Hall Courts"), renovated in 2010, is comprised of 2 outdoor basketball courts, 2 sand volleyball courts and 1 outdoor fitness court. The Rec SportsPlex, opened in 2007, is a 104-acre facility on the Tallahassee Campus Southwest. The Rec SportsPlex is comprised of 21 sports fields for various outdoor team sports; approximately 58 acres of the facility is playable space with the remaining space dedicated to support facilities, parking, and future development. The amount of outdoor fitness/recreational space is satisfactory for the current student population.

Additional indoor space is available for intramural sports and sport club activities in Tully Gymnasium, a shared-use facility among Campus Recreation, Intercollegiate Athletics, and the Department of Sport Management. The 4 full-size basketball courts are utilized by all three groups on a nearly daily basis. Limited indoor court space is available in the Leach Center, including 3 basketball courts and 6 racquet sports courts. The amount of indoor recreational court space is inadequate at this time, due to heavy use.

Table 6.3 shows the number of ball fields, courts, and etc. information for fitness/recreation activities. Although there is some sharing of facilities between intercollegiate athletic and fitness/recreation facilities, identification has been made based on primary use. The FSU band field is also used secondarily for fitness/recreational, but it has not been included with the primary recreation fields.

1.d. Space Use Standards

1.e. Existing Space Utilization

FSU does not record space use for the space types listed in 1.a. above. Support area needs are calculated from FTEs.

2. Future Needs/Requirements

2.a. Projection of Future Support Service Activities

Florida State University is planning major expansion of support facilities. The master plan also depicts several projects intended to expand and/or renovate. Many of these projects are in the "Major Opportunity Areas" envisioned for the Tallahassee Campus of this Campus Master Plan: the Northwest Quadrant, Mendenhall Site, and Arena District. There are plans for new construction along the new Gateway Road planned for Tallahassee Campus Southwest. A more detailed description of each individual project discussed in this section may be found in Element 14 – Capital Improvements.

In the area of administrative space, the University routinely reviews its current inventory of space and seeks to balance the need for new space in as efficient manner as possible. Though there are no plans to construct new administrative buildings at any of the three sites included in the Campus Master Plan, there are a number of smaller initiatives being considered to improve existing administrative areas on campus.

Funding has been requested for Satellite Utility Plant #3 on the Tallahassee Campus. The plan also requests funding for a Facilities Support Building, Warehouse Relocation, and Grounds (Nursery) Relocation for the Tallahassee Campus Southwest. Additionally, there is roadway funding requested for the Blueprint Gateway Road and Tyson Road Extension for Tallahassee Campus Southwest. For the Panama City Campus there is request for rerouting N. Bay Drive and a Surface Parking Expansion.

During the next planning period, the Department of Business Services expects to continue its on-going efforts to provide students better food service and commercial venues. A parking garage as well as a dining hall built in conjunction with student housing is planned for the northwest quadrant of campus. Larger Auxiliary initiatives include the Arena District Hotel and Convention Center. Near the proposed convention center, there are plans for a Reimaginers Collaborative Center. A mixed-use development is planned for the Tallahassee Campus Southwest. A Conference Center is planned for the Panama City Campus and a Student Housing Joint Mixed-Use Development (Not managed by University Housing) is currently being built there.

There is much planned for Student Support in the next planning period. Two new Residence Hall Replacement Buildings, yielding 1,800 beds is planned as well as seven residence hall renovation projects for the Tallahassee Campus. A newly constructed Flying High Circus facility as well as a new Student Recreation Center (undetermined location) is also planned for the Tallahassee Campus. Athletic facilities for the campus are also planned in the form of a new Football Operations Facility, an expansion of the Basketball Training Facility and a renovation of the University Center Building D. The Tallahassee Campus Southwest has plans for Phase 2 of the Intramural SportsPlex and Tennis Courts Expansion.

2.b. Analysis/Assessment of Athletic/Recreation Facilities Needs

With the addition of the Rec SportsPlex in 2007, the amount of outdoor recreational sports space currently exceeds the amount recommended for FSU's student population size. However, Florida State University remains undersized in indoor recreation space. The 2019 HOK/ALW Campus Recreation Master Plan, supported by the Brailsford and Dunlavey's (B&D) Report indicates a demand of 3 times existing for Weight & Fitness and Group Fitness/Multipurpose space. Additionally, the B&D report reveals an additional need of sixteen basketball courts, half inside and half outside facilities. Eleven

additional tennis courts are needed for outdoor recreation. In addition there is a need for recreation facilities not currently represented such as softball, sand volleyball, leisure swimming and rock & sport climbing.

2.c. Projections of Future Space Utilization

As stated in 1.e. above, FSU does not record utilization for the space types listed in 1.a. above. Support area needs are calculated from FTEs.

2.d. Future Net Support Space Needs

Following are projections of the future (2022-23) net support space needs for support space types as described in the University's most recent Educational Plant Survey. **Table 6.5** shows projections for the Main Campus (Tallahassee Campus). The Board of Governor's Educational Plant Survey no longer includes Satellite Campuses, therefore Panama City Campus projections included in **Table 6.6** of previous Campus Master are not available.










